

Kierra Eck of the Sunflower 4-H Club from Midway District, is the State 4-H winner for Foods and Nutrition Project Record Book during the Emerald Circle Banquet on June 6th.

One state winner is selected yearly from the senior division (ages 14-18) in 28 project areas. Youth display leadership skills and heart of service by organizing local and state



events, such as project meetings, presentations, teach other youth, promoting the projects on State 4-H Council, and many other unique efforts. Besides learning how to keep good records, youth gain new skills in the project, demonstrate growth in leadership, civic engagement, and communication within project.

Members submit a report form at the local level. Then can compete at the regional level by submitting a report form, resume, and cover letter. Members then compete at the State level and submit a report form, resume, cover letter, and video.

Award winners were recognized during the Emerald Circle Banquet, which is held during Discovery Days, June 5th through 7th. This event is hosted each year by the Kansas 4-H Foundation.

The State 4-H Project Award Winners are eligible to attend National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia, in November.

Congratulations again to Kierra Eck on being the State Project winner Foods and Nutrition.




