Many of the events and paperwork, most definitely the paperwork, for 4-H can be overwhelming for new 4-H families! This page will be used to highlight things that may be helpful to know in regard to upcoming events, deadlines, and necessary documents. Your Club Leader is also a great resource!

Record books, Project Records, Pin Applications and Achievement Banquets will all have deadlines to occur in the very near future.

Record books are often held in a green 4-H binder (available at the Extension Office for \$3.25)

**In order to receive an Achievement Pin (with the exception of the membership pin), 4-H members must submit a complete record book to the Extension office. Complete record books must include (in order):

Personal Page (signed by member, parent, leader)
Permanent Record
4-H Story (signed by member)
Pictures (optional)

Project Record Forms- these can be held in the same binder as the record book.

These records are individual project records that will be completed for judging to be named a county winner in the project area for which you apply! You may fill out as many project record forms as you would like, though focusing on just a few projects and really doing well on those would be my suggestion over doing many project records and not giving as much detail.

Remember that there are different forms of project records for each level (7-9, 10-13, 14 and up). In addition, it is important to adjust the story in your project record to focus on the particular project area including areas of leadership and community service. While you may mention other project areas, this is an opportunity to really let your involvement in this particular project shine!

Pin Applications-Pins provide an opportunity for recognition of continued development and are awarded at the Achievement Banquet.

Club leaders can be provided with a list of members and their eligibility for achievement pins. Please check with your club leader (or the office) if you need to verify the appropriate level pin. You will want to apply for these in order as once you have achieved a specific pin award, you cannot go back to a previous award category. Ellsworth's banquet will be October 22nd and Russell's banquet will be October 23rd this year. This evening is a great opportunity to share fellowship with other 4-H families while celebrating accomplishments!

Financial Review Time!

Club Financial Reviews are due to the Extension Office by October 19.

Please establish your committee now to carefully review the finances and fully complete the form.

Kansas Extension law, as well as federal and state expectations for use of all funds generated in support of Extension programs, require the Director for Extension and Extension Council/District Boards to be accountable for non-appropriated

funds generated for Extension programs within their jurisdiction. In other words, the Director for Extension and the

Extension Board are accountable for funds raised and/or collected by such groups as 4-H Clubs, 4-H Councils, etc. In order for the local Extension unit to ensure compliance with financial requirements for 4-H and other Extension affiliated groups, a yearly financial review of those accounts is to be conducted by a Financial Review Committee of the club/group. Approval of the reports is documented by the local unit board, recording in their minutes a motion to approve the reports, including in the minutes the name of each club/group. This review and board approval is required of all clubs/organizations.

To be an a 4-H Ambassador:

- You are interested in public speaking and making presentations in front of
 - groups.
 - You are in the ninth grade or above.
 - You have completed two or more years of 4-H.
 - You agree to give two presentations on 4-H each year.
- You agree to be interviewed by judges to discuss your application.

What is an Ambassador?

4-H Ambassadors should be looked to as the "Face of 4-H" for the local program. Their role is to tell the 4-H Story through media, personal appearances, and other avenues. Some of the responsibilities of a 4-H ambassador include:

- Promote 4-H to all Audiences
- Work with 4-H Agent and 4-H PDC to promote and assist at events
- Further their own communications skills
- Organize promotional events and activities (may be in conjunction with Jr. Leader teams)
- Network with non-4-H groups (Kiwanis, Rotary, other community
 - organizations)
 - Attend trainings as offered.

There will be a maximum of 8 Ambassadors selected. Ambassadors are selected for a 2-year term!
